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2. What is the particular relevance of the activity to purposes and objectives the 2003 Convention and its compliance with the principles of the Convention?

The Directorate of ICH of the Hungarian Open Air Museum organized the Whitsun Heritage Festival - International Gathering of Intangible Cultural Heritage for the eleventh time on the Whitsun weekend, 28th–29th of May 2023. Apart from celebrating the elements of intangible cultural heritage inscribed on the national inventory of Hungary, dancers and dance anthropologists from different countries were welcomed, such as Colombia, Spain, India, Costa Rica, Brazil, and Indonesia. Thanks to their collaboration, visitors of the museum had the opportunity to enjoy folk dances from all over the world on stage and through workshops. Our aim is to sustain the tradition of an annual gathering of bearing communities and experts of ICH from Hungary and abroad as well, to represent the diversity of the Representative List and the Register of Good Safeguarding Practices of UNESCO. This festival serves both as a professional exchange of experiences in connection with intangible cultural heritage and also as an entertaining introduction of the heritage elements.

Different kinds of customs, performances, music, dances, crafts and oral traditions were represented from the national inventory of ICH and good safeguarding practices by the heritage communities from different parts of Hungary. The participants had the chance to exchange practical ideas and experiences regarding visibility, sustainable development and safeguarding measures. Moreover, the general public had the opportunity to get to know the heritage elements and participate in their programmes, workshops and dance-houses.

The event and the connected media coverage help to raise awareness of the importance of ICH and contribute to celebrating cultural diversity. As in previous years, the event was held on the Whitsun weekend, which was an opportunity for a 100 local children to present the rich Hungarian Whitsun customs to the visitors of the museum.

In the framework of the twentieth anniversary of the Convention for the Safeguarding of the Intangible Cultural Heritage, the Directorate of Intangible Cultural Heritage of the Hungarian Open Air Museum launched a creative competition entitled 'Our Living Heritage'. The creative competition was aimed at young people from the age of 7 to 18. Applicants could choose from six themes, based on the Hungarian heritage elements from the Representative List of Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity: Hungarian string band tradition, Lipizzan horse breeding tradition, Falconry, Blue-dyeing tradition, Folk Art of the Matyó, and the Busó festivities at Mohács. Students used different artistic techniques to express their ideas and their own unique vision about living heritage. A jury of artists, museum educators and heritage experts selected 37 awarded artworks, divided into five age groups, sent from all over the country and beyond. The award ceremony took place on 28 May 2023 at the Whitsun Heritage Festival in the Hungarian Open Air Museum where the winners could meet with the members of the heritage communities they had depicted, and receive their gifts. The best works of art were displayed in an exhibition at the museum, which will be available as a virtual exhibition on the website of the Directorate of ICH in Hungary (<http://szellemikulturalisorokseg.hu/>).
